#### HOLIDAYS FOR HEROES

Federation members participated in our project by collecting and writing Christmas cards destined to be delivered to our troops serving overseas. Clubs and members were asked to deliver them to Carol Hayes, Project Chair, at our September General Meeting. In the then just over two month life span of the project, more than 2000 cards were collected. Of course, the work did not stop there. All cards needed to be read for compliance (cards could not be sealed, have no personal signatures and no glitter). An immediate solution to "delivery logistics" was another hurdle.

This was made possible through the generous support of Dobbins Air Reserve Base (ARB) and the 700<sup>th</sup> Airlift Squadron under the Command of Col. James W, Kellogg, JR. In order to be able meet Dobbins approval and access requirements in our very short first year time frame, the Federation partnered with a another organization already working with Dobbins, The Order of The Eastern Star (OES) in Georgia.

On October 30<sup>th</sup>, Carol Hayes, Project Chair and Barbara Maaskant, who as a member of both groups coordinated the liaison effort, traveled to Dobbins ARB to deliver the cards. Joining them from The Order of The Eastern Star were Worthy Grand Matron June Mathews, and 2017-2018 OES Grand Family members, Virginia Lawton and Kathy DeFord.

Representing Dobbins AFBR was Sr. Master Sergeant Aaron Abshire, 1<sup>st</sup> Sergeant for the 700<sup>th</sup> Airlift Squadron and Angela Petersen, Family Readiness Director.

DeKalb Federation's donations were combined with those of other organizations for a total of 17, 658 cards handed over for delivery.

The 700<sup>th</sup> airlifted the cards to Kuwait. From there the cards were distributed to locations where the troops are stationed. Along with SMSGT Abshire was Staff Sergeant Andrew Park, Public Affairs Specialist, 94<sup>th</sup> Airlift Wing. SSGT Park was especially proud to be part of the turnover and shared that when stationed in Kuwait last year he saw cards displayed with pride where ever he went. "Christmas is the same as every other day where we serve. It was a huge morale boost and reminder to the troops that the folks back home care and pray for their safe return."

For DeKalb Federation, it was an excellent start for such a young project, so let's begin gathering cards for this year! Congratulations to all for your part in this benevolent project for our brave men and women far from home. God bless our military and keep them safe. (Article Written by Barbara Maaskant)

#### WATER REPORT

USING IT: The presumably unending dispute about the waters of the Chattahoochee River and the Flint River that merge to flow into Florida, as well as forming much of the border between Georgia and Alabama, is currently in the hands of the U.S. Supreme Court. Florida brought suit against Georgia over withdrawals, each side had 30 minutes to present its side, the case was heard, and the decision of nine judges will determine much about water withdrawals by both states and by implication, all three of them.

How withdrawn water will be used is much of the reason behind the case. Yes, the rich soils of the mostly winter warm three states are located where two crops, and depending on the crops themselves, sometimes three crops a year are possible. Beyond that, water consumption by both agriculture and manufacturing including both hard goods and the power to produce them are not always a stated factor. Add growing populations, especially in the Atlanta area, and the question of withdrawal and use becomes more complicated.

Suggestion: for a more global view, read "When the Taps Run Dry" in the February 19<sup>th</sup> issue of TIME. Remember also that water is indeed a natural resource, not a renewable one like trees, but finite. Some will remember the statement from a major GCG program that all of Earth's water has been around since the dinosaurs.

**PROTECTING IT FROM HARM:** DeKalb Federation members and residents across Georgia have an opportunity to make a major difference in water protection. The Georgia General Assembly is in Session now, and two Bills have been introduced to help protect the waters of Georgia, to keep them swimmable, drinkable, and fishable. They will, of course, go through the committee process and will need to be approved with possible amendments by both the GA House of Representatives and the GA Senate before they go to the Governor for his signature. Follow both these Bills in their process through the **Georgia General Assembly website**, as well as the websites of major conservation organizations like Georgia Conservancy, Georgia Sierra Club, Georgia Water Coalition, Environment Georgia and others.

Inform yourself and contact your State Senator and Georgia House Representative. If you do not know them, find out about them. Meet them at Capitol Conservation Day. Call them, send them emails. Your voter registration card has the numbers of your House and Senate districts.

Let the people elected to represent you know what you think about the following two Bills.

- 1. HB 879: disposal of waters drained from retention ponds, especially from coal fired electric utility plants. Such water contains arsenic with which any reader of Agatha Christie is familiar as poison.
- **2.** HB 880: placing waste, especially from coal fired plants, and especially from other states into landfills in Georgia.

Government

Plans call for a Breakfast Legislation Briefing at 7:30 a.m. at Central Presbyterian Church, located across the street from the State Capitol. If members cannot "get to the church on time," then they may join the group on the steps of the Capitol at 10:00 a.m. for a group picture, then inside for the opportunity to meet with local legislators to share concerns with them. Several conservation/environmental bills and resolutions have been dropped in the last week in both the Georgia House of Representatives and the Georgia Senate, joining several which were already in the Committee Action process (two of which are outlined in the Water Report above).

Resolutions calling for the banning of offshore drilling off the Georgia Coastline have been introduced in both the house and the senate. They are HR 1041 and SR 706. You can read them by going to the Georgia General Assembly website.

HB 158 which calls for fees paid by Georgians for a dedicated purpose to be used totally for that purpose is waiting to be taken up in house rules which, if approved, would send it to the house floor for a vote. Other bills of interest include a bill regulating fracking in North Georgia (HB 206) and a bill to reinstate tax credit for electric cars purchased in Georgia (HB 98). HB 332 and HR 238 would provide a source of funding for land conservation with the passage of the Outdoor Stewardship Act (GOSA).
