PUBLIC GROUNDS IMPROVEMENT GRANT

Did you know that DeKalb Federation has a grant that supports member clubs in improving public grounds, including school grounds, libraries and other public areas? Up to two \$250 grants are available each year. Grounds Improvement includes beautification as well as environmental education. Last year, projects at Smoke Rise Elementary School (**photo below**) and the Tucker Police Station were funded.

To apply, clubs should submit the following: location of the project and how the project was selected; the scope of the project; value to the community and how it will be maintained; club participation in the project; before and after photographs. Clubs may apply for this grant at any time during the year for new or ongoing projects. 
GARDEN CLUB OF GEORGIA AWARDS
